Edith Williams rented the house in the late 1920s, newly weds artist Thora Unger and George Johnston lived in the house in 1934 and 35, and Eric and Molly Nicholls rented the house and later bought the house after that. A semi-detached garage designed by Griffin c.1926 was not built. Eric Nicholls added a semi-detached garage in the late 1940s and a second storey of two bedrooms and a bathroom shortly afterwards, as well as the cast iron gate and sandstone gate posts. In the early 1980s an additional bedroom and bathroom were added to the upper level.

Description:	The original building retains its configuration of rooms and most of its features, with the exception of the room linking to the addition, and the enclosed porch.
	The living room is the focus, projecting forward to capture the view of Middle Harbour. Its rectangular form and dimensions are typical of the demonstration houses with the stone fireplace at one end – the geometric centre of the composition, based on squares and rectangles, and a continuous belt of windows capturing the views (as advocated by Griffin in 'Sunshine in the Home') at the other. The fine ashlar craftsmanship of the fireplace is accentuated by steel-framed glass cabinets set into stone, which echo the crystalline shape and 45 degree of the windows, and the original windows used the same narrow steel frames.
	The large front garden, created by the Nicholls, demonstrates the benefits of staggered setbacks, creating a wonderful treed space with paths of random local stone.
